To mark the 70th anniversary of Queen Elizabeth II on the throne, Canada created a series of initiatives to honour the queen's service and dedication to our country. She was Canada's longest reigning Sovereign and the first to celebrate a platinum jubilee.

Members of Parliament were provided with limited supplies of commemorative pins, bearing the platinum jubilee emblem. The emblem contains the Royal Cypher of Her Majesty The Queen, EIIR, which appears in the centre. It's framed with a 7-sided shape, along with 7 maple leaves and 7 pearls to mark the 7 decades of Queen Elizabeth II's reign. The emblem is framed in red and white to represent Canada's national colours with the Royal Crown appearing at the top of the emblem.
